A BIBLIOGRAPHY OF MATERIALS AVAILABLE IN THE LIBRARY SYSTEM OF THE UNIVERSITY OF THE PHILIPPINES ON THE MODERN HISTORY OF SOUTHEAST ASIA

ONE OF THE RESULTS OF WORLD WAR II WAS THE INCREASED FOCUS OF interest by scholars on the region that became known as Southeast Asia. Prior to 1941, few of them were concerned with the area that lay in an arc between India and China. But the Japanese occupation changed all that. The needs of Allied intelligence as well as the general wartime publicity were parts of the process of discovery; many of the academicians and future researchers received first-hand contact with the area through participation in the armed forces.

For some, the interest in the region did not falter with the end of the war. The post-1945 nationalist upsurge in Burma and Indonesia, the onset of the cold war, the emergence of Red China as a leading power in Asia, and the addition of six new countries to the United Nations—all these, gave added stimulation for study. By the middle of the 1950's, many new courses in various disciplines offered students a chance to study Southeast Asia and, at least, two universities—Cornell and Yale—had full departments for interdisciplinary work in the area. Since that time, the field has grown rather than declined in number of active scholars, programs and students. Each year, the number of studies on Southeast Asia has increased significantly.

What this trend of interest has meant in terms of literary output is that, by and large, the vast majority of works dealing wih Southeast Asia have been written since 1945 and that no bibliography which incorporates only prewar materials is of great value to the active researcher. Indeed, any bibliography more than a few years old, is out of date in a field where pioneering works are still being written.

The original purpose of this bibliography was to supply a reading list for the students of History 154, the history of Southeast Asia, taught at the Diliman campus of the University of the Philippines. It then seemed to be a logical follow-up to expand the original list to include the complete holdings, to date, on modern Southeast Asian history, to serve as a guide for future lecturers and students of the subject. For such a purpose, it seemed necessary to supplement the guide with the list of avail-

able periodicals and bibliographies. Because of the shortage of primary and secondary materials on the rest of Southeast Asia here in the Philippines, it seemed advisable to publish the completed survey of books. If kept up-to-date, it could prove useful to historians in the Philippines who find American guides of limited value. It is hoped that some of the other libraries will follow a similar program to keep scholars informed on the latest source material available.

The bibliography contains all the holdings in the various branches of the library system as a service to all U.P. students since there is no single repository for the Southeast Asian collection. Likewise, the call numbers have been included as a time-saving device for the general scholar as well as the student. As soon as the library receives sufficient funds to increase its microfilming services, it will be possible to make copies of rare materials, including primary sources.

The present list has been limited to Burma, Thailand, Malaysia, Indonesia and the new countries which formerly constituted part of Indochina. The Philippines has been excluded from the list, not because the compilers did not consider it part of Southeast Asia, but because the holdings are too extensive for article publication. The catalogue of the Filipiniana section contains the complete list of Philippine holdings.
